





About Richmond County Schools

Richmond County, North Carolina is most famous for the Rockingham Speedway. Beginning in 1965, The Rock, as it is now affectionately known, hosted decades of stock car racing legends. The county's population instantly doubled on the weekends of major events, including The American 500, the track's inaugural event, and an annual favorite.

When high-stakes racing wasn't in town, Rockingham and Richmond County fell back into the slower pace of a typical sandhill, rural county. Much of the area remains as such today.

Situated roughly halfway between the cities of Charlotte and Fayetteville, Richmond County is home to 46,639 residents. Of those, 7,368 attend one of the county's sixteen public schools.

Michael Williams, IT Director for the school district says that, "We believe that our educators continually strive to leave a lasting legacy in and out of the classroom by Inspiring Excellence.

The Problem

Perhaps nowhere has security been more in the news cycle than regarding our school systems. IT Director Williams cited quality as the main concern for Richmond County schools.

"The existing security cameras were extremely out of date. A large portion of the cameras was not functional and the remaining cameras' images were not distinguishable."

This common complaint occurs when discount-bin cameras are used for initial installations. Cost cutters who fail to appreciate the lasting value of commercial-grade equipment, such as all of SCW's, end up spending more over time due to poor quality. Too many uninformed purchasers are paying for blurry, unusable images.

The second concern related to the need for increased camera coverage. "We were not able to adequately monitor all areas of the buildings," said Director Williams.

Budgetary challenges face all publicly funded institutions. Fortunately, the staff of security experts at SCW was capable of configuring camera layouts to maximize coverage within the constraints of limited funding.
